

### Cross-Country Ski Trails



The trails wind along the rolling hills and through the spruce, pine and aspen forest on the north side of Jacobsen Bay, Trails are typically groomed once per week or as conditions dictate.



### Tower Trail



Start at the Anglin Bridge and follow the wide and winding access 3 km to the summit. A beautiful cabin and a bird's eye view of Anglin lake and the Spruce River awaits.

### Spruce River Highlands Trail



Follow the Tower Trail for 1.8 km, then take the 1 km connector trail into Prince Albert National Park. This 8.5 km loop trail is packed for snowshoeing, fat biking or backcountry skiing. A Prince Albert National Park pass is required and is available for FREE throughout 2017.

### Trailhead

Parking is located at Jacobsen Bay boat launch, The trailhead is just west of the parking area. From here, follow the trail along the lake shore to the bridge. A second trailhead (with minimal parking) is located at the Anglin Lake bridge.

### Warm-up Shelters

The Tower Cabin has been converted to a warm-up shelter. Spend a few hours or the night in the backcountry cabin. Firewood is provided. A small shelter is located along Moose Trail. It is equipped with firewood and a stove.

 **Snowshoers and Walkers**, please avoid stepping on the groomed tracks.

### Be Prepared

Cellular reception is intermittent around Anglin Lake. Remember to pack extra clothing, food, water and compass/gps. Always travel with a partner and let someone know where you are going and when you will return.

### Be a Good Guest

- Remember to pack out what you pack in.
- Sorry, no snowmobile or ATV access.

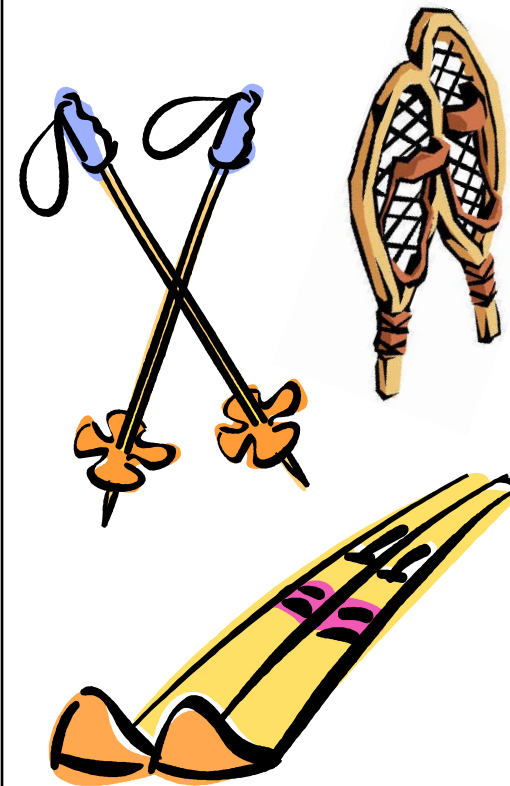

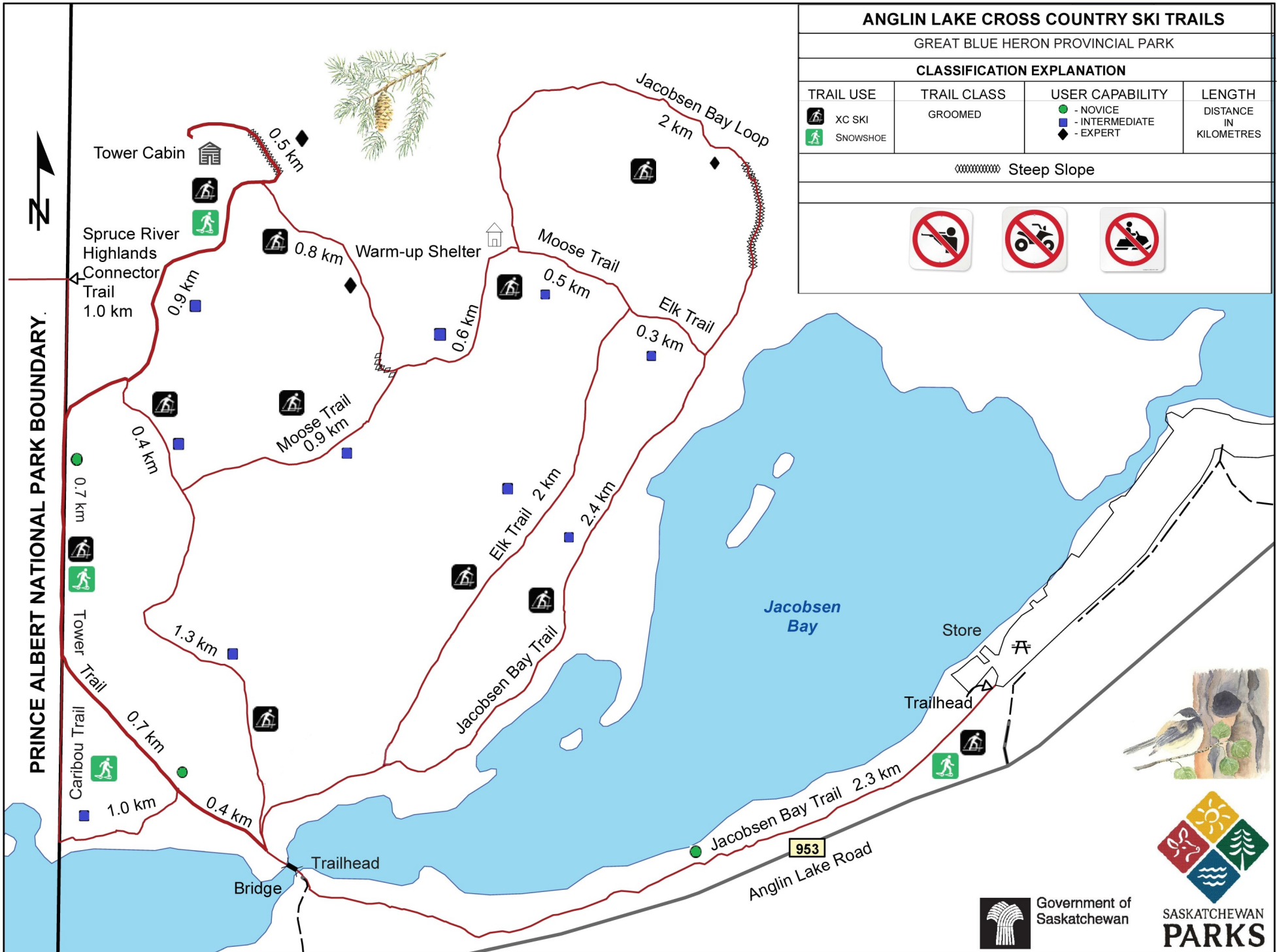
